Fine Art Registry Website Evolves and Expands.

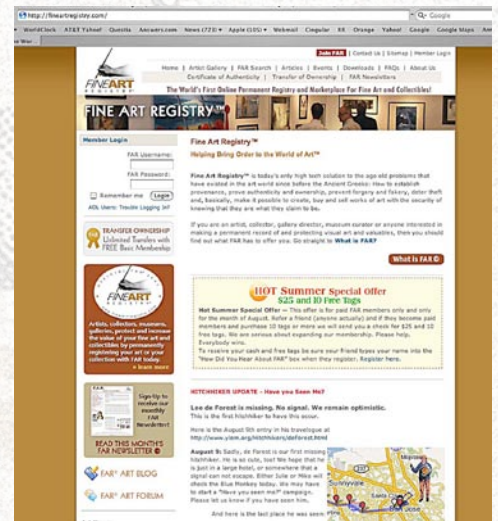
